PERSONAL:

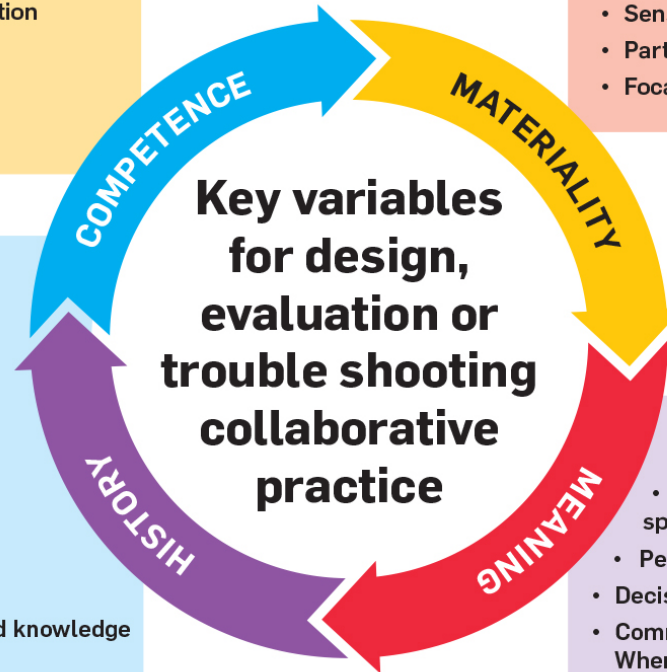
- Openness

MEANING

- Conceptual underpinnings
- Participants identification with kaupapa
- Group sense of ownership and agency
- Sense of legitimacy
- Participant sense of identity, responsibility and mandate
- Focal issue is seen as complex

HISTORY

- Development and implementation of scope, horizon, composition
- Credible and legitimate partners providing mandate and sponsorship
- Perceived system failure or system frustration
- Decision and commitment to share power
- Commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi and relationship with Mana Whenua
- History between parties
- Political mandate and opportunity for key parties
- Positive experiences of engaging community-based expertise
- Bounded opportunity – temporal imperative

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
